

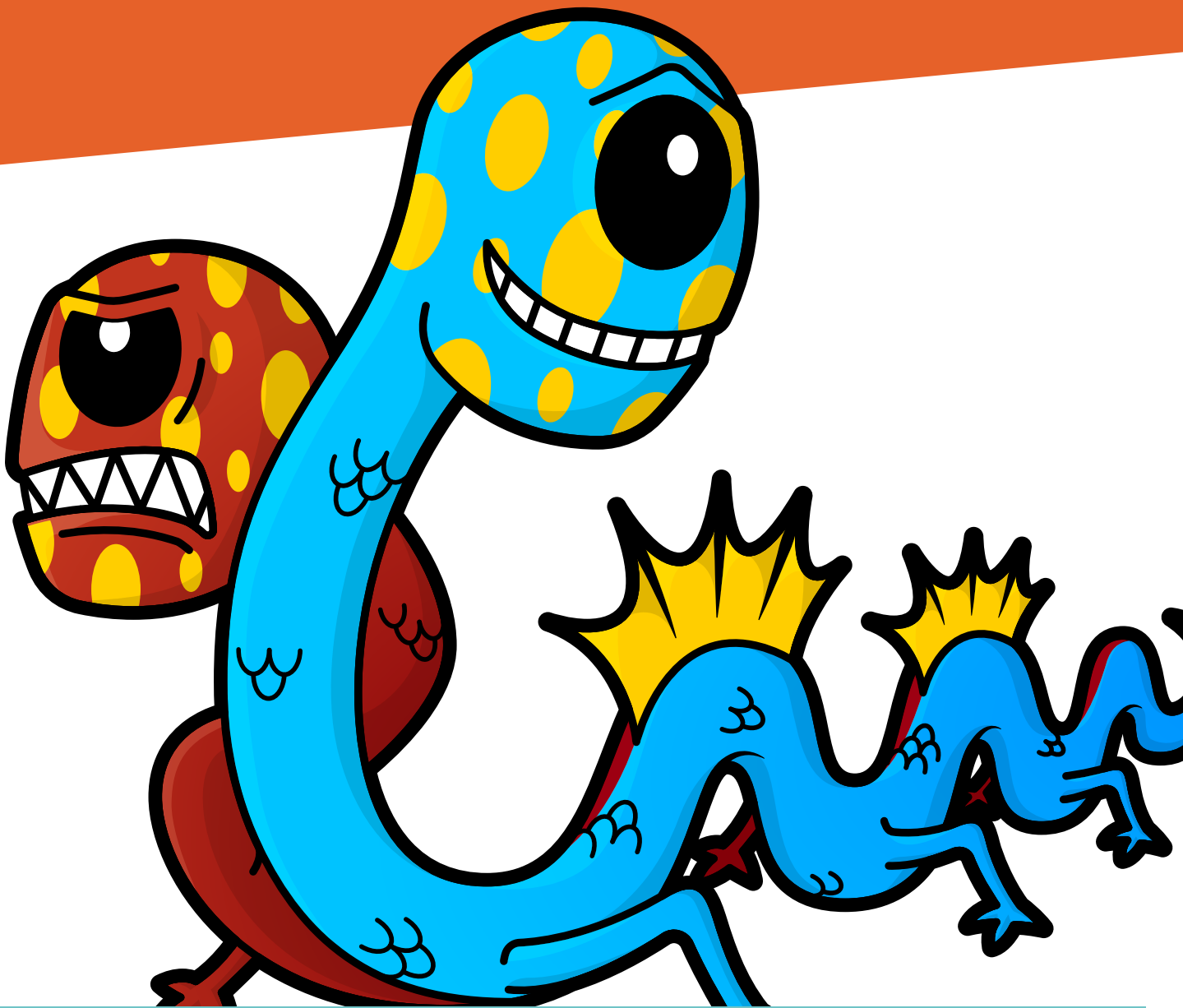

MEET BI-DIPHOROUS:



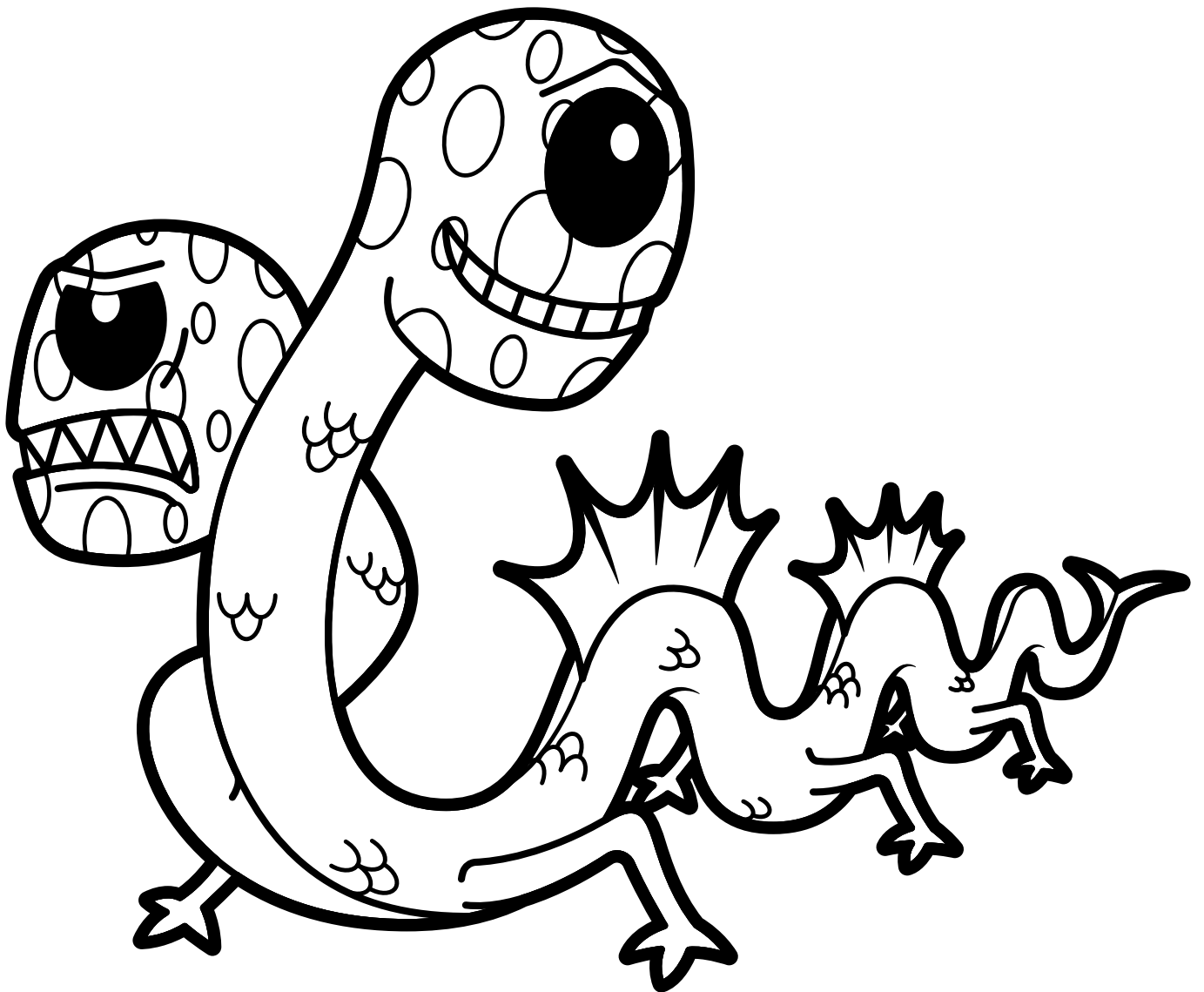
Bi-Diphorous is a monster of two sides. He tricks people in the digital world by presenting himself as a friendly 'online friend' to make people like and trust him. He will then reveal his unfriendly side and make you feel uncomfortable online.

Your task is to help Internettie and Agent Justice defeat Bi-Diphorous. You will learn some of his tricks and tips on how to spot unsafe conversations, have safer online friends and where to report if anyone makes you feel uncomfortable, pressured or worried online.

Remember if in doubt give an adult a shout!

Colour in your own version of Bi-Diphorous, and perhaps even draw or write what he is after? You may want to do some of the other activities first.

Ask a grown up to take a picture of your Bi-Diphorous and post it on Facebook, Twitter or Instagram with the hashtag #CyberAmbassadors.



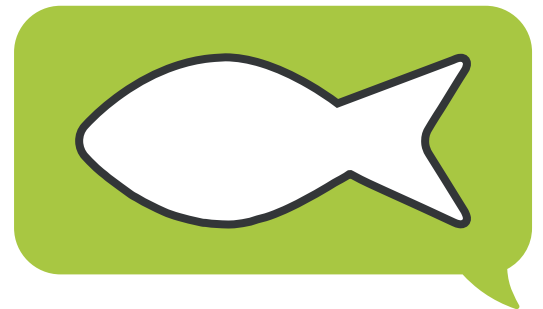
SPOT BI-DIPHOROUS TATA (TELL A TRUSTED ADULT)



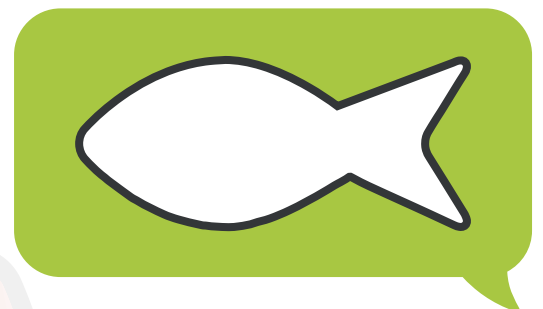
Your favourite games may be on an online platform with a chat function. This chat function may allow a username that you do not know to send you a message.

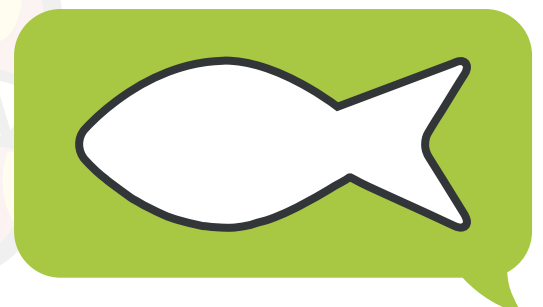

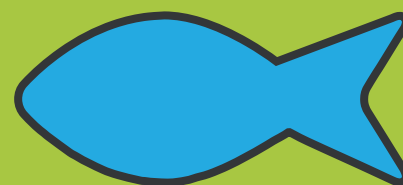

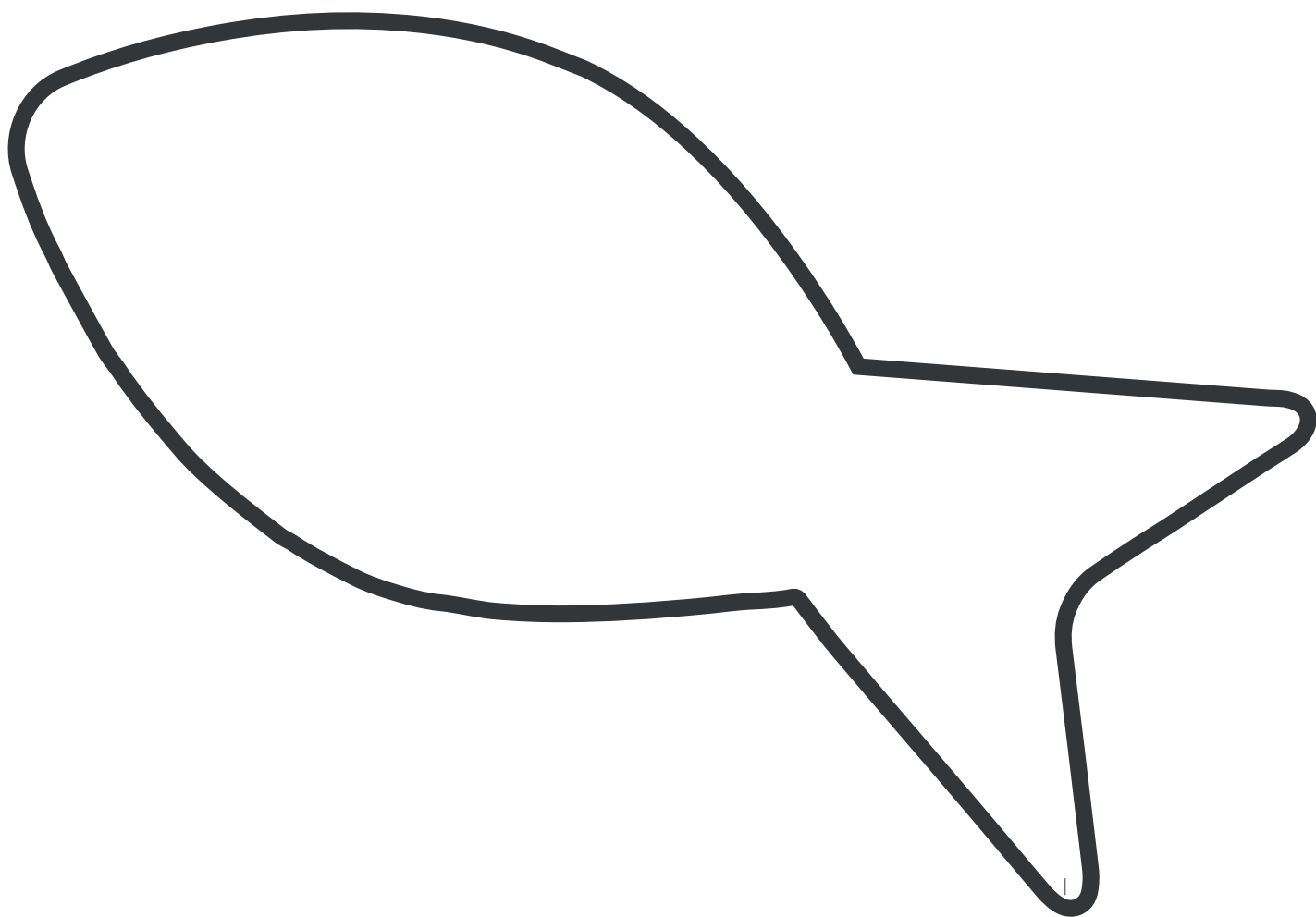

Before talking to someone online, you checked with an adult.

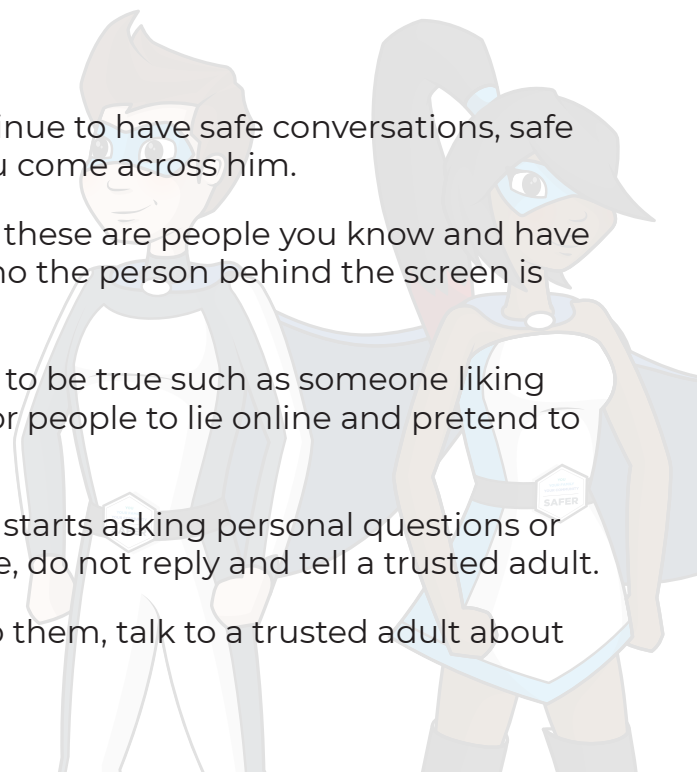
Muted the chat or microphone in a game when not using it.

Join servers or play online with friends that you know in real life.

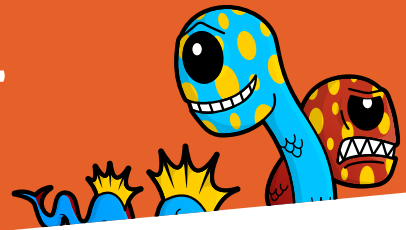
#GOFISH TIPS

Here are some #GoFISH tips on how you can continue to have safe conversations, safe online friends and defeat Bi-Diphorous should you come across him.

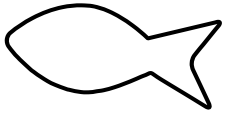
- Your real life friends are safer 'online friends' as these are people you know and have met before in real life. You will be able to tell who the person behind the screen is when chatting online.
- Look out for anything that may seem too good to be true such as someone liking everything that you like. Remember it is easy for people to lie online and pretend to be someone who they are not.
- If you are chatting online and the other person starts asking personal questions or asking you to do things you find uncomfortable, do not reply and tell a trusted adult.
- If you make an 'online friend', before you talk to them, talk to a trusted adult about the online friend and show them their profile.



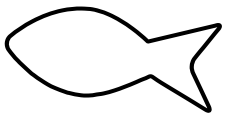

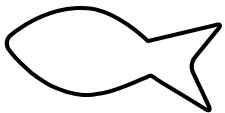
Are you ready to continue helping safer superheroes tackle their next mission? Next time you go online tick if you do any of the following:



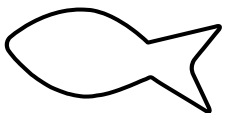
Make sure any social media accounts or online gaming platforms are private to stop people you do not know from being automatically added to your friends list.



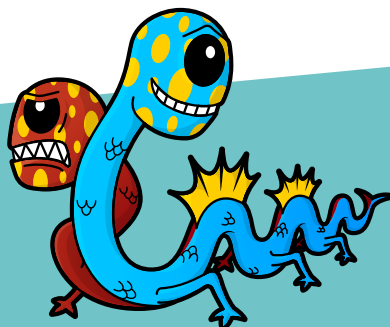
Look for the block and report buttons on the sites you are using.

ONLINE FRIENDS are friends that people make online but have never met them in real life.

REPORTING OR SEEKING SUPPORT FOR UNWANTED COMMUNICATION ONLINE

Click CEOP (www.ceop.police.uk/safety-centre) is a reporting platform for unwanted online communications which children may find uncomfortable, worrying or scary. Ask a trusted adult to help you with making a report on this platform.

If your child does not want to talk to an adult they trust, they can call Childline (www.childline.org.uk) on 0800 1111.
