Please provide the following information for your Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Programme for the 2022/2023 Financial Year	
1. The Name/Title/Scope of the commissioned programme in your area including programmes designed for male victims that accept/engage/support females	The OPCC did not directly commission Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Programmes in 2022/23, with the exception of CARA (Cautioning and Relationship Abuse) (an awareness raising an out of court intervention for individuals using abusive behaviours in their intimate and non-intimate relationships). However, the OPCC contributed funding to the Local Authority contracts that deliver Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Programmes. Therefore, the individual submitting the request may wish to contact the Local Authority directly for further information. Hampshire and Southampton – Perpetrator Services (Hampshire and Southampton) – Hampton Trust provide the service and deliver the ADAPT (Accredited Domestic Abuse Prevention Training) programme accepting referrals for residents of Hampshire and Southampton age 16 and above (not going through the Criminal

	<p>Justice System) using abusive behaviours in an intimate relationship          Portsmouth – Integrated Domestic Abuse Service for residents of Portsmouth – Stop Domestic Abuse provide the service and deliver Portsmouth City Councils Up2U: Creating Healthy Relationships programme as part of the integrated contract. The service provides specialist support to anyone (men, women or non-binary) aged 16 and over who acknowledge they use abusive or unhealthy behaviours within their relationship and want to change and who are not going through the criminal justice system for domestic abuse.</p> <p>IOW – Integrated Domestic Abuse and Sexual Crime Service – Hampton Trust were subcontracted by You Trust to provide the perpetrator element of this contract. They delivered ADAPT. Over 18 years, not in the Criminal Justice Service.</p>
